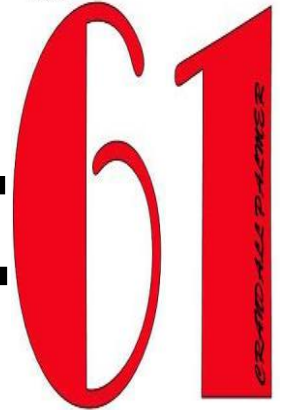

Americanism Team,

As 2014 comes to a close I would like to thank the other members of the American Legion Family for their support of Americanism initiatives that were carried out this year.

2014 saw renewed relationships with JROTC; your support was instrumental in sending a Rifle Team from Arizona to the Jr. Olympics Competition for the first time in over 30 years. We also raised thousands of dollars for several JROTC Programs across the valley. These relationships are ultimately important when we consider that over 30% of these JROTC Cadets will join the Armed Forces and be eligible to join our American Legion Family.

In addition to our work with the JROTC's we also developed relationships with Estrella Mountain Community College performing Flag Disposal Ceremonies that were attended by their students and professors alike. It was honor for me to a part of this program in 2014 and I would like to make a commitment to serve in the same or any capacity in 2015 to continue the great Americanism work of the Crandall-Palmer Family.

The mission of our Americanism Program is to educate America's young people about the moral, political, social and economic values that made America free and strong. Educate them in an ideology or belief in devotion, loyalty, or allegiance to the United States of America, its flag, traditions, customs, culture, symbols, institutions, and our form of government.

Americanism can refer to the defining characteristics of the United States and can also signify loyalty to the United States and a defense of American political ideals. These ideals include, but are not limited to self-government, equal opportunity, freedom of speech, and a belief in progress. This collection of ideals that forms the modern Americanism ideology holds an enduring appeal to people from lands throughout the globe. Unlike the patriotisms associated with other powerful countries, Americanism is rooted less in a shared culture experience and more in shared ideals. The concept of Americanism has been around since the first European settlers moved to North America. John Adams, a New Englander, once wrote that the new settlements in America were "the opening of a grand scene and design in Providence". This transformed type of Americanism was common thinking throughout the New World after the war for independence. The newly independent nation would end up becoming more than what Tom Paine called "an asylum for mankind".

Please join me in making 2015 a productive year as we get our message out to more and more members of the Avondale community.

We have added a new Monthly Inducement Door Prize on the 1st Tuesday of every month. The double action game is a coverall game with a 50/50 pay out for a price of \$ 1.00 per sheet.

Enjoy a Tuesday night at Post #61 Bingo with minimal cost, a visit to the food table and good times.

Anyone age 18 or over can play Bingo on any Tuesday. The games start at 6:45 PM so stop over around 6:00 PM and enjoy some of the refreshments and snacks supplied by the Legion.

Drop by any Tuesday and see Rick from 6:00 PM to 9:15 PM, see how our Bingo program is run and meet the Post #61 Family members currently working. Volunteer workers can be anyone who has a current Post #61 membership' in the Legion, Auxilliary or S.A.L. and is at least 18 years old. All that you need to do is work one Tuesday a month of your choice from 6:00 PM to 9:15 PM.

QUEEN OF HEARTS RULES

CRANDALL PALMER POST 61

1. Raffle is open only to American Legion/Unit or SAL Members.
2. The Raffle Committee consists of the Executive Committee chaired by the Commander.
3. Game starts with 54 cards (including Jokers).
4. Tickets are \$1.00 each or 6 for \$5.00.
5. **Print your name on back of ticket.** Only 1 name per ticket.
6. Three tickets will be drawn each week. If ticket is pulled without a name or more than one name that ticket will be considered void and another ticket drawn.
7. The three tickets will then be put into another container and drawn one at a time. The first two tickets will receive a drink chip.
8. If the person whose name is on the third ticket IS present he or she will point out which card they want selected.
9. If the person whose name is on the third ticket is NOT present a randomly selected person will select the card.
10. If the winner is not present prize must be claimed within 30 days.
11. Drawings will be held each Saturday Night at 8:00PM. Sales will close at 7:45PM. Tickets will be sold Mon, Wed, Fri and Sat.
12. All tickets will be discarded after each drawing.
13. Winners over \$300 will be paid by check. Winners of \$600 or more will be required to provide 2 forms of ID and fill out a W2-G.
14. All chosen cards will be displayed until the Queen of Hearts is drawn.
15. If the Queen of Hearts is not drawn the winner will be paid according to the payout chart.
16. The game ends and a new game start when the Queen of Hearts is drawn.
17. 5% of the pot total will be rolled over to start the new game. (This will come from the Posts' part not the winners' part).
